

## Introduction from our CSEL

As Catholic Senior Executive Leader, I am pleased to introduce the Our Lady and All Saints Multi Academy Company 'We Are All Saints... Children's Charter.' This sets out our approach and aspiration to delivering a truly Catholic educational experience for all our children and young people attending our academy schools.

In the most basic sense, a saint is a "holy one," someone who is set apart for God's special purposes. As a result, every follower of Jesus Christ can be a saint. By following the examples of the saints, we will guide, lead and teach our children to emulate their virtuous behaviours and to follow in their footsteps.

Children and young people will potentially face a world where there may be indifference to the needs of the poor, gross inequality, injustice and climate change challenges which threaten God's creation. #### YFS

- 1. Participate in Vocations Day
- 2. Answer 'Who is God calling me to be?'
- . Understand the belief that God gives them gifts and explore what their gifts and talents are
- . Experience a new sport/activity every half term
- 5. Be offered at least two extracurricular sports clubs each year (1 free club)
- 6. Experience competitive sports during an annual 'Sports Day'
- 7. Join in with a healthy living event

#### KS1

- . Participate in Vocations Day and reflect on what God calls them to be
- 2. Share the talents God has given them
- 3. Answer 'Who is God calling me to be?' and 'What is my fantasy career?'
- 4. Openly share their hopes and dreams
- 5. Be offered at least four extracurricular sports clubs each year (1 free club)
- 6. Compete in an inter school sports competition

#### KS2

- 4. Know that God gives them gifts and understand how these can bring joy to others
- 5. Learn to swim 25m unaided and develop water safety

- 8. Learn simple First Aid training
- 9. Participate in at least one alternative sports or physical activity e.g. boccia, rowing, yoga, etc.)

#### KS3

- 1. Through form time and PSHE lessons, students learn about their personal skills and qualities
- 2. Students in Year 9 make informed choices for their GCSE options subjects, considering where their options might lead them on their future pathway
- 3. Explore Christian vocations and discern our faith journey
- 4. Develop an understanding of human dignity and put this into practice in school, at home and in in the wider community
- 5. Become a leader (Form Captain)
- 6. Answer 'Who is God calling me to be?' and 'Based on my skill set, what could my career be?'

- 1. Through form time and PSHE lessons, students learn how their personal skills and qualities can be applied to various career paths
- 2. Students in Year 11 and 13 make informed choi<mark>ces</mark> for their Post-16/18 pathway, considering where their options might lead them on their future pathway
- 3. Learn for the role models of our faith the saints and philosophers who guide us in life
- 4. Explore ethical and moral dilemmas form a Catholic perspective
- 5. Become a leader (e.g. Peer Mentor, Prefect)
- 6. Answer 'Who is God calling me to be?' and 'Based on my skill set, what could my career be?'
