Most castles had a great hall, a kitchen, chambers and stables. A king, queen, lord or lady was in charge of a castle. Lots of other people lived and worked in castles doing jobs such as cooks, blacksmiths, soldiers and servants and a priest. Entertainment in castles included banquets, jousting, jesters and falconry.
