As Christians there is a far more important event which we celebrate just after half-term, the Feast of All Saints on Tuesday 1st and the Feast of All Souls on Wednesday 2nd November. The Feast of All Souls reminds us that the dead are not to be feared but loved and helped with our prayers. The wonderful things proclaimed in these two days are not to be passed over lightly. We can do so because we believe in the communion of saints - a community created by Christ that shares in his risen, healing love.



Sunday's Gospel

Taken from the Gospel for 23rd October 2022 (Luke 18:9-14): The Pharisee and the Tax-Collector

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else. "Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood there and said this prayer to himself, 'I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get.' The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner.' This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted."

School Uniform - Reminders

Just a few reminders in regard to school uniform.

Marvellous Me Communication App

The majority of parents have now signed up to our new Marvellous Me app. After half-term, all classes will use Marvellous Me to share information. You will receive:

- Notification when your child has earned a House Point.
- Messages from your child's class teacher and the school office mostly reminders.
- Notification when your child has earned a badge (further details to follow)
- Regular information regarding your child's learning. You will be encouraged to ask your child
 about a particular aspect of their learning 'Tell me about.....' Asking your child to recall and
 share their learning will help them to remember.
