Sunday's Gospel First Sunday of Advent

The Gospel for Sunday 27th November 2022 - Like a Thief in the Night (Matthew 24:37-44)

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left. So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the house-holder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

Some cars have been parked across the entrance area just off the Stratford Road which has the potential to cause a serious accident. Cars have also been driven over the grassed area which reflects lack of care and concern for the Church property. I ask you kindly to not use the front area and leave it for parishioners attending morning Mass. Thank you for your understanding.

Classroom Visits

This week, there was an opportunity for you to drop into classrooms to see your child's learning environment and some of your child's learning activities. Next Friday, 2nd December, your child's pupil report card will be updated; these will be available for you to view via their MS Teams account. Week commencing Monday 5th December, teachers will be holding their second round of pupil review meetings - bookings will open next Tuesday. These meetings are an opportunity for: your child to discuss their learning with their teacher, to review their targets agreed in pupil review one, and to agree their next steps. This child centred approach is fundamental to our new arrangements as we try to empower children to have greater ownership of their learning and their achievements.

School Attendance Reminder

Our Lady of the Wayside has set an overall pupil attendance target of 97%.

If your child is not in school, they are not in their lessons and they are not being taught the knowledge and the skills they need to achieve well. Where a pupil's attendance figure drops below 90%, the Department for Education classifies them as being a 'persistent absence (PA)'. If your child is a PA, we will contact you to discuss their attendance and the support we can offer. Where appropriate, Our Lady of the Wayside School will seek the support of external educational welfare services. If you are struggling to send your child to school, we would urge you to contact school (Mrs Lloyd) who will talk through the issues and how we can assist. If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school office as soon as possible and no later than 9:30am please. If we haven't heard from you by 9:30am, we will contact you directly. If we are unable to make contact, we will undertake home visits.

The impact of pupil absence on teaching and learning when measured over a school year:

It is important your child also arrives on time. School gates open at 8:30am. Your child is expected to be in their classroom by 8:55am, at the latest. Being regularly late has a real impact on their learning:

5 minutes late each day	3 days of lost learning
10 minutes late each day	6.5 days of lost learning
15 minutes late each day	10 days of lost learning
20 minutes late each day	13 days of lost learning
30 minutes late each day	19 days of lost learning

- 3. Lids wrapped separately from the main box (so that the Sanctuary can easily check the contents).
- 4. Lids labelled with gender and approximate age.

- pens/pencils/crayons/notebooks

It is essential that children regularly attend school, poor attendance has a serious and long lasting impact on your child. To promote and encourage good attendance we publish weekly attendance figures.


