Mr Taylor - End of Term Easter Reflection

Dear Parents,

As the end of the term approaches, and we reflect on the meaning of Lent, we consider the Easter story:

"Knowing that everything had now been finished, and so that Scripture would be fulfilled... Jesus said, "It is finished." With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit" (John 19: 28-30).

Christians believe that on Easter Sunday, Jesus rose again from the dead. He came back to life, defying expectations. We also believe that in this event good overcame evil, life is stronger than death and that light shines through the darkness. And that's the challenge for us all - life undoubtedly has its challenges for each and every one of us, but with a belief that the darkness can and will be overcome by light then we can tackle those challenges head on and overcome them. For our school community, Jesus is our guiding light, and teaches us the way that we should live out our lives.

This is no more important a message than now. In our world we see inexcusable acts of violence, none more so than the events in Ukraine over the last 12 months. There are, however, so many other conflicts around the globe which do not always receive the same amount of coverage. For those affected by any conflict in our world, we offer up a prayer for peace:

We pray that their efforts may be blessed, that they may bring an end to violence and solace and stability to suffering peoples.

May the gift of peace permeate all troubled souls, convert all who live by violence and comfort all children who live in menacing situations, that the freedom to enjoy life and grow in safety may be theirs. And may each one of us know peace of mind and heart, peace of body and spirit, peace of community and world.

Holy Spirit of Peace, grant our prayer.

Amen.

I hope that you and your family have a relaxing and joyful Easter break. I look forward to welcoming our children back ready on Monday 17^{th} April ready for a busy Summer 2023 Term.

Brain Teaser

Last week's brainteaser:

Around 25 families have signed up for our 'Wayside Womble Project'. It is not too late to join. Here are all the details:

Linked to the King's Coronation is the Big Help Out Project. This initiative aims to encourage people to help out/volunteer in their local community. Our Lady of the Wayside School are keen to undertake a 'Big Help Out Project' within our school and parish community. After talking to the children, we have decided upon the 'Wayside Womble Project'. During the weekend of the Coronation, Our Lady of the Wayside families are invited to support their local community by collecting a bag of litter. There will be a special Wayside Womble Award for all children who have taken part. Below are some additional details:

When are the dates for Wayside Womble Project? This project takes place during the Coronation weekend - from Saturday 6th May to Monday 8th May.

Will equipment be provided? Yes, a litter picker and a litter bag will be provided to each family on Friday 5th May. You will need to register beforehand.

What will happen to the litter we collect? Please bring your bag of litter to Our Lady of the Wayside School on Tuesday 9th May. The bags of litter will be collected by Solihull Council.

Is there a cost? There is no financial cost, just a bit of time litter picking as a family in your local area.

Does my child receive a reward for being part of the Wayside Womble Project? Yes, every child who completes this project will receive a special 'Wayside Womble Award', this will include a special badge which they can wear on their school uniform during the summer term. Please note, children will only have completed the project when they return their bag of litter on Tuesday 9th May.
